Can you advise us on our eligibility?	<p>Thank you for your interest in this procurement of R&D services. We welcome proposals from all eligible applicants, as long as they are not debarred from participating in any public tenders.</p> <p>It is important to note that the intent of the Innovation Challenge is to eventually procure the developed innovative solution in a commercially viable manner. Therefore, you may want to consider your application or identify a close industry partner to work with to increase your selection chances. Please keep in mind that time-to-implement is a shortlisting criterion, and commercialisation and implementation plans are evaluating criteria.</p>
2	Reference to Clause 1.2 - Funding, Terms of Participation in JTC Innovation Challenge. It is mentioned that significant expenses should be justified with supporting documentation e.g. quotes. Is online pricing of items acceptable for proposed items? Or does it have to be a formal quotation from suppliers?	In addition to formal quotations, openly available quotes or catalogue prices are also acceptable for proposed items.
